### **COOR GENERAL EDUCATION DEPARTMENT & COOR COORDINATING COUNCIL FOR PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT (CCCPD) PHILOSOPHY OF PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT**

Through the planning and decision making of the COOR Coordinating Council for Professional Development (CCCPD), the COOR General Education Department provides regional professional development opportunities for our local administrators and teachers. This group consists of representatives from each of the local districts. The members provide the major communication link between the local districts and the General Education Department. Together, assessment data is examined, professional judgment of local district members is solicited, and common needs are addressed. After inclusion of this information and extensive discussion, a program of common professional development is planned. This program attempts to help districts with state and federal mandates, school improvement, and accountability.

Over the past year, the focus has been on bringing together members of the ISD to create a literacy plan that can be adapted for each building, extending knowledge of the practices of science and mathematics, discourse and writing in all content areas, building knowledge of the connection between instruction, observation, coaching and evaluation.

The addition of Early Childhood Services to the General Education Department has been a tremendous asset in solidifying services across the continuum from birth to graduation. We rely upon the input from the Great Start Collaborative whose members are representative of this population of child throughout all of our counties in addition to Iosco County.
