JOB DESCRIPTION

TITLE:

SCHOOL PSYCHOLOGIST

JOB OBJECTIVES:

Provide evaluation and consultation services to students with suspected disabilities and students with disabilities.

POSITION OVERVIEW:

The School Psychologist evaluates children with suspected disabilities. In addition, they provide consultative services to teachers, administrators, and parents. These services may include individual, classroom, or building-wide behavioral, individual therapeutic, or systemic consultation. The school psychologist is also expected to become involved in the pre-referral process of the local district they are assigned. This position is considered at risk for exposure to Hepatitis B and may come in contact with hazardous chemicals.

ESSENTIAL JOB FUNCTIONS:

- 1. Participate as a member of the I.E.P.T. (Individualized Evaluation Planning Team) and member of the M.E.T. (Multidisciplinary Evaluation Team) when appointed by the Supervisor / District Designee for initial, change of status, and three-year re-evaluations.
- 2. Communicate in clear, understandable language, evaluation results to parents, referral sources, and colleagues within the school setting prior to the IEP meeting.
- 3. Maintain accurate records in a manner consistent with State and Federal Law as required by the Intermediate School District and Local Educational Agency.
- 4. Assume responsibility for keeping informed of current developments in own field and related field of special education and maintain readiness to adapt to change.
- 5. Have knowledge and ability to assist school districts in developing, implementing, and maintaining a system-wide Multi-Tiered Support System (MTSS) program, including knowledge of assessment systems, managing data, and collaboration.
- Maintain a bi-weekly schedule within the assigned service area. Deviations from schedule are subject to prior approval of supervisor.
- 7. Maintain a cooperative, harmonious relationship with professionals and others within the school setting which fosters recognition and respect for every individual.

- 8. Organize time, energy, and workload in order to meet responsibilities and complete assignments with due consideration of priorities among various responsibilities as approved by supervisor.
- Participate in school improvement activities such as curriculum development committee, positive behavior support committee, etc. as delegated.
- 10. Physically capable of performing C.P.I. (Crisis Prevention Institute) personal safety techniques, lifting and positioning students.

SKILLS AND/OR EXPERIENCES:

- 1. Full approval and certification as a school psychologist by the Michigan Department of Education or eligible for temporary approval. Applicants must possess a valid Michigan driver's license.
- 2. A minimum of two (2) years successful experience/training as school psychologist preferred.
- 3. Expertise in the area of IEP process and procedures.
- 4. Previous experience training or presenting information to educators and administrators.
- 5. Training and/or ability to access data from a variety of sources to assist with on-site technical assistance.
- 6. Able to work independently, problem-solve, and find solutions to challenging situations.
- 7. Ability to efficiently use computer and applicable software, uses equipment and materials properly.
- 8. Strong written and oral communication skills.
- 9. Assume responsibility for keeping informed of current developments in own field and related fields of special education and maintain readiness to adapt to change.
- 10. Provide pre-referral services according to the appropriate State and Federal Rules and Regulations following the procedures of the local district to which they are assigned.
- 11. Performs other related duties assigned by the Director of Special Education or Supervisor.
